Threesa Milligan is the former Director of Pro Bono Services, the King County Bar Association's pro bono legal aid program. Threesa is a graduate of the University of Washington School of Law. She was in

private practice as a family law attorney until taking the position of Executive Director of Snohomish County Legal Services in 2001 where she remained until January of 2010 when she took on her current role at KCBA, the largest pro bono program in the state of Washington. Threesa is Co-Chair of the Access to Justice Delivery Systems Committee and serves on the ATJ Nominating and Leadership Development Committee. Threesa helped develop the Washington State Pro Bono Council in 2012, bringing together the 17 Washington pro bono programs to give pro bono a voice in the state and promote collaboration among these very diverse programs. She serves on the Executive Committee of the Council. Threesa is a conducts annual trainings nationally for the ABA Center for Pro Bono, training new managers from all over the United States. Threesa is committed to the goal of providing meaningful access to justice for all and to inculcating a culture of pro bono civil legal aid throughout the bar. She received the Access to Justice Leadership Award in 2013.
